

Sub ject	What is my child learning about at school?
Conject	Fiction: The Abominables
	Your child will be learning to retell a model text based on <i>The Abominables</i> . They will use this to help them plan and write a short story that focuses on setting description. We will create realistic settings, ensuring correct use of punctuation.
English	<b>Non-fiction:</b> This term the children will be writing a persuasion text. They will study various examples and use these to write their own. They will think carefully about structuring their text and choose appropriate grammatical features to ensure it flows.
	Continue adding to your glossary of interesting words and phrases you find. Remember, at Floreat we have a 'magpie wall', which we use to store shiny words that the children like so that they can use them again later. Encourage your children to steal vocabulary that shines!
	Nelson Handwriting Your child will continue to write with their 'Perfect Pencil Grip' and 'Posture for Writing'. All Year 4 children will continue to practise joined-up Nelson Handwriting.
Writing	All children now write in exercise books without tramlines.
	You can support your child by ensuring that they sit properly on their chair with their feet on the floor, facing the table with a pencil in their writing hand and their other hand on their work. Please ensure that your child completes their home learning in joined up writing and with a sharp pencil.
	Whole Class Reading
	This term your child will be reading <i>The Abominables</i> which will support the learning the children will be completing in English. The text will be used to develop the children's vocabulary; abilities to infer, predict and explain; and the skills of sequencing and summarising a text.  As well, this will be an opportunity for the children to develop their confident reading voices. We are hoping to develop their ability to express and use intonation appropriately.
Reading	Please support by correcting spellings while your child is doing their Home Learning. At Floreat, we are direct when giving feedback e.g. a child spells the word 'accident' with an a > accidAnt, we say "In this word the sound is represented with an 'e'."
	Read with your child as often as possible! And, crucially, <i>re-read</i> with them. If your child has read a text out loud to you, ask them to re-read it once they have gone through the decoding stage. This will help comprehension. Finally, read it <i>to</i> them. This models intonation and expression when they re-read it for a final time.
	Ask your child to summarise what they are reading. Challenge them to create summaries of a section of text with fewer than ten words.
	Maths This term we will continue our learning on multiplying and dividing whole numbers by IO and IOO using our knowledge of place value. We will learn how to use known facts to support us with unfamiliar facts. For example, we can use the fact $15 \div 3 = 5$ to help us calculate the answers for larger unknown facts such as $1,500 \div 300$ and $1,500 \div 3$ .
Mathematics	Pupils will learn the II and I2 times tables and the patterns within them as well as the relationship between them. Within these lessons we will continue using the 'distributive law'. Throughout the term, we will continue to practise our multiplication facts using the math's challenge approach. This term we will continue to learn the nine times tables and progress onto the seven times tables. In all math lessons the children will be working on their investigative skills as well as mathematical reasoning.
	You could support at home by asking your child questions about their math learning. For example: prove that what if if this equals what might this equal? If we know that what else do we know?  E.g. If we know that $17 + 17 = 34$ then what does $170 + 170 = ?$

Knowledge	Science — We will be learning about 'Sound'. We will learn how sound is produced, how it travels through the air, what pitch and volume is, how the human voice makes different sound and the different parts of the ear.  History — This half term, your child will study, 'The Rise and Fall of Rome' They will learn about the Punic Wars, Julius Caesar and the rise of Christianity.  Geography — This half term, your child will be learning about, 'Northern Ireland'. They will identify key features of Northern Ireland, locate and label Northern Ireland on a map and understand the reasons for Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland being separate.  Art— We will be learning about 'Monuments of Ancient Rome' which links our history knowledge to our art this term.' We will learn facts about the Pantheon, the colosseum and Trajan's column before constructing our very own pantheon.  RE— We will learn about Christian celebrations including Advent, Shrove Tuesday, Lent, Easter and The Pentecost as well as why and how Christians celebrate them.  You can support your child at home by questioning them about the areas we are studying this half-term and encouraging them to read widely around them too. Any additional knowledge that your child brings to the classroom will be duly celebrated!
Character	Character - This half term your child will be focusing on the virtues courtesy, kindness and honesty.  PSHE - This term, we will be looking at "Healthy Me". Within this topic, we will look at friendship groups, leaders and followers within friendship groups, smoking and alcohol and its effects on our health, reasons people choose to smoke or drink alcohol and feelings when under pressure.  Music - This term we will be listening to 'Lean On Me', which we will learn to sing so that we can discuss and learn about the elements of this genre of music.  Spanish - This half-term, Year 4 will be using Language Angels to learn the unit "La clase" (The Classroom). During this unit, we will recall 12 classroom objects with their indefinite article, learn how to replace an indefinite article with a possessive adjective, and say and write what they have and do not have in their pencil case.  Dance - This half-term, Year 4 will be learning Dance. We will be working creatively in groups, improvising and linking clear, intentional movements.  You can support your child by discussing the world around you, stories you read and the things that you see and hear. It would be great for you to share your own experiences of when you have shown the above values.
P.E. and gymnastics	This term in PE, the children will be learning about Tennis. Within Tennis, they will be learning how to perform forehand, backhands, volleys and smashes all from the ready position. The children will also learn how to throw a 'feed', supporting their partners' development also. *Year + will learn Netball in Summer Term 2*.  Please ensure your child comes into school wearing their full P.E. kit on their P.E. day. Children will not be getting changed at school until further notice.

General reminder — Please ensure that your child has a waterproof coat in school **every day** so that they can play outside come rain or shine. It is getting very cold, and we don't want any children being uncomfortable or getting ill.
