



The right choice of independent school

This booklet is one of two guides which the council makes available each year to parents of children in the borough's primary schools who will be transferring to secondary school next September.

While *Choose a Wandsworth Secondary School* remains the essential reference document for anyone interested in the borough's maintained schools and academies, *Choose an Independent School* looks at the options for those able to consider a fee-paying alternative.

We include those independent schools which are actually Wandsworth-based or fall within easy commuting distance.

Additionally, we have included Lord Wandsworth College in Hampshire, which has a link with the Borough of Wandsworth. The College can be reached within one hour by train or car and provides both day and boarding places for children who have lost the support of one or both parents.

Each school offers some form of financial assistance towards the cost of the place, usually through a limited number of bursaries or scholarships.

Although the publication is a Wandsworth Council initiative, it is wholly funded by the schools. I hope you find it a helpful source of ideas and information as you set about the task of finding the right school for your son or daughter.

Dulwich College offers a caring, supportive and well-ordered environment in which boys from a variety of cultural and social backgrounds can feel secure and equally valued. The College is academically selective and welcomes pupils into Year 7, Year 9 and Year 12 from a wide range of schools from both the maintained and independent sectors.

Founded in 1619, Dulwich benefits from historic buildings surrounded by 70 acres of well-kept grounds and sports fields. The College has some of the best facilities in the area and a long tradition of academic, cultural and sporting success. A level results now show more than 90% of results regularly at A*, A, B grades. Nearly all leavers progress to degree courses at top universities with more than one in ten going to Oxbridge.

Each pupil at Dulwich is provided with an appropriate academic challenge to allow all boys to achieve their potential, whilst a huge range of co-curricular activities and clubs and societies inspire students to develop valuable skills of team work and leadership.

Music and Drama flourish at Dulwich and many gifted musicians are attracted by the high standards and excellent facilities. Dramatic productions at all levels of the school are regularly staged in the College's own Edward Alleyn Theatre. In addition to rugby, football, hockey and cricket, more than 20 sports are regularly played at Dulwich and all pupils are encouraged to find a sport and develop a breadth of interests which will harness their enthusiasm and talents.

Lord Wandsworth College

Lord Wandsworth died in 1912 and left a large sum of money for the foundation of a school. The co-educational College that bears his name now occupies a large, rural campus on the North East Hampshire/Surrey border just one hour by road or train from Wandsworth.



Each year a small number of children are offered a **Foundation Award**. This is a means tested award for children who are in need of pastoral care and a boarding environment in which to thrive. The child must have been born a British citizen and lost the support of one or both parents through death, divorce or separation, with priority being given to those who have lost a parent through death.

There are currently 46 Foundation pupils throughout the College, having the same opportunities as full fee paying pupils and not identified in any way.

The campus provides a safe and secure environment where children can flourish. Our pupils achieve consistently good GCSE and A Level results through nurturing rather than a 'hothouse' system. Each of our students is a member of one of our eight boarding houses which are staffed by teams of houseparents, tutors and matrons. The houses provide a family atmosphere and give the students a strong sense of belonging.

Whilst academic study is our priority, we firmly believe in the value of an all-round education and, to this end, life at LWC is packed with opportunities outside the classroom. We enjoy a successful record and reputation in sport with many students achieving county, regional and national standards. Our music, art and drama departments are well resourced and are renowned for producing outstanding concerts, exhibitions and productions.

Students also have the chance to take on the challenge of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme or become a member of the Combined Cadet Force. Only by coming to the College and seeing it at first hand can you appreciate the strong sense of community that makes LWC so special.
