

- We firmly believe that **creativity** must be at the heart of everything we do from writing a story to making up a game on the playground.

- All adults and pupils learn to take on challenges with a **positive** and solution-driven approach.






The performance charts below represent the achievements of our pupils since we began in September 2015. Keep it up everyone!

RECEPTION: Pupils achieving a **Good Level of Development** are those achieving at least the expected level within the following areas of learning: communication and language; physical development; personal, social and emotional development; literacy; and mathematics. Most children in this school meet or exceed the expected standard for their age group.



YEAR 1: At the end of Year 1 pupils take a **phonics reading challenge**. The results of this challenge help schools to understand how successful their taught method of reading is. Nearly all children in this school meet or exceed the expected standard for their age group



ROAD SAFETY

Dear Parents,

We'd like to ask for your consideration of a very important topic of road safety around the school and developing a road safety task force. Last year Mills Brough and Simon Wood, made a great start with the council by getting them to change signage and road markings near the school as a bare minimum.

With the school growing in size, the number of children having to cross Garratt Lane is increasing and the forthcoming Atheldene Road development will increase heavy duty vehicles in the area.

To help improve Road safety FOFW and the school would like some support in campaigning for improved road safety provisions. This task force is likely to be made up of parents and representative/s from the school.

It could be helpful to have knowledge of town planning / planning law / government procedure but mainly have the drive and passion to improve the health and safety for our kids.


