Wider Curriculum	All pupils across the school will focus on the enquiry question 'How can data help us understand the world around us?'. Year 4's project will investigate how we can reduce evaporation in a bird bath and result in pupils designing, prototyping and then producing bird baths which can be used in our school garden. Within this project, children will build on their Science, Art, Maths, DT & Geography skills. Pupils will learn about states of matter and materials, the water cycle, living things. Additionally, pupils will be able to describe and understand key aspects of physical geography and talk about weather and seasons in the UK. Computing – Pupils will learn that the World Wide Web is part of the internet and will be given opportunities to explore for themselves in order to learn about who owns content and what they can access, add, and create. Finally, they will evaluate online content to decide how honest, accurate, or reliable it is, and understand the consequences of false information. RE — This term's topic is "Inspirational Christians." Pupils will explore Jesus' teachings on peace, love and forgiveness and how these inspire Christians today. They will reflect on the lives of figures such as Martin Luther King and Mother Teresa, compare Christian beliefs with other Bible-based religions, and consider how biblical teachings in fluence choices in the modern world. You can support your child at home by questioning them about the areas we are studying this half-term and encouraging them to read widely around them too. Character	Character - Your child is learning about Self-Control and Dignity, Zones of Regulation and working towards completing a Service Learning Project. Whilst looking at these virtues, we will explore real life contexts that the children might find themselves in and how we could approach these situations. These virtues will be embedded through discussion and stories as well as activities rooted in reality that will bring the learning to life! PSHE - In PSHE this half term, Year 4 will focus on 'Being Me in My World' where we will learn we will learn about working as a team, democracy, the school community and decision making. We will look at the responsibilities that go along with these and the rewards and consequences that can result from decisions that are made. Music - We are going to be exploring a number of aspects of music through ABBA's song, 'Mamma Mia' including how music makes us feel, how it is structured as well as the influence that music can have on culture. Spanish - The focus for Spanish this half term is on phonics and pronunciation, ensuring that we are saying the sounds correctly in Spanish to improve our understanding and speech. In terms of developing your child's character, really question them.
