



## FLOREAT WANDSWORTH SPORTS PREMIUM REPORT 2022/23

### What is the Sports Premium Grant?

The Sports Premium Grant is additional funding from the Government to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. It is also for improving the health and wellbeing of primary pupils.

### How much is the Sports Premium Grant?

Allocations are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6

Schools with 16 or fewer eligible pupils receive £1,000 per pupil.

Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil.

For Floreat Wandsworth Primary School, this amounts to **£18,370** for 2022-23.

We are using this allocation to achieve a number of sustainable objectives:

1. To develop and enhance the teaching of high-quality PE across the curriculum in all classes.
2. To develop the leadership of PE to enable sustainable quality provision.
3. To provide opportunities for physical activity due to the restrictions of our site.
4. To increase our resources/equipment for the delivery of P.E.

### What is the Impact of the Sports Premium Grant?

We anticipate that Sports Premium Grant will lead to:

- Increased opportunities and levels of participation for all of our pupils when accessing a wider variety of PE and Sports (6 themes across the year)
- Opportunities to develop the skills of sportsmanship
- Develop pupil understanding of the importance of keeping fit and healthy, as well as, ways that they can improve their health and fitness.
- Pupils who are fitter, healthier and are motivated to continue to improve.
- Better standards in swimming with bespoke booster classes.

The use of the Sports Premium Grant is monitored and reviewed by the SSB annually.

When the school was closed pupils had access to remote PE videos tailored to their age range.</p> <p>No PE lessons will be cancelled due to the impact of the weather and the coaches will be able to split into two small groups in the hall.</p> <p>Pupils were all able to engage in PE within small groups. Physical Equipment for the playground	£3000	<p>The school has identified a small minority of pupils as 'non-participants' in lunchtime and after-school sports activities.</p> <p>We have identified play equipment which will promote physical development as well as encouraging their self-esteem. All children will have access to this equipment during the allocated break times throughout the year.</p>	<p><i>Monitoring:</i> Staff will be trained by the SLT in how to promote fun and enjoyable physical play using the equipment.</p> <p><i>Sustainability:</i> All children will have access to this equipment throughout this academic year and beyond.</p> <p><i>Impact:</i> Children develop their self-esteem, hand-eye coordination, teamwork skills, core body strength and cognitive functioning.</p> <p><b>2022/23 IMPACT</b> - Pupils have been able to engage with high quality sports equipment both during their break times. Basketball and football have been a particular success as indicated during a Pupil Voice session. Associate Staff target individuals and groups of pupils to engage in structured activities promoting positive self-esteem and physical activity. Strategical leadership has a positive impact on the playground set-up and use of Associate Staff. The needs of the pupils are met alongside wider support strategies e.g. ELSA.</p>

The school is committed to long term progress for all pupils. We will do this by investing in the following initiatives during 2023-24:

- ✓ Continue to provide extra swimming lessons to those who need it and improve on the percentages recorded during 2022-23.
- ✓ Ensure pupils have access to a wide range of interactive and physical activities on the playground.
- ✓ Ensure pupils have access to best possible coaching through the AMSA training model with all coaches overseen by a line manager who will have consistent expectations of pupil progress, achievement, attitudes to sport, levels of participation and behaviour management
- ✓ Focus on physical exercise and play during break time (the school will look into recruiting staff to focus on particular playground activities e.g. basketball).
- ✓ Ensure teachers are trained by PE coaches to lead PE teaching and learning from 2024-25.

## Pupil Voice

Upon speaking to children across the upper school about their views and opinions on PE and Sport, here is the feedback we received:

The children thoroughly enjoyed PE this year, with the favourite subjects being Football, Gymnastics and Tennis. The children would also like to see Basketball back in the PE curriculum.

Gymnastics was a big favourite with a child saying "I loved gymnastics because it kept us warm during the winter and it was so much fun". Alongside this, some students asked if we could get some more advanced equipment within our lessons, similar to the ones we use in our clubs.

Another request from our children was whether we can use "bigger goals" during PE when learning about football. Alongside PE, the fixtures this year were a hit among the children. One child said "they loved going on fixtures, as it allows them to play sport with their friends".

Multiple Year 5 children also said that they really enjoyed the Cricket festival, learning more about batting, bowling and fielding.

The children have requested that next year, we have MORE fixtures, with some sports including "volleyball, swimming, bowling, croquet, golf and badminton".

Children from across the school loved Athletics and Sports Day, with children asking to do Athletics Fixtures throughout the year also. One child did say "I loved sports day, but could we do it on a day which is not as hot" - I'll try!

Lastly, a child in Year 4 said "this has been the best year of PE ever, there was lots of fun sports to learn about, lots of fixtures and all the coaches were great".

This academic year, we have had **23 Fixtures**

## Statistics

Across all the children in Years 1-6, we have had **180 children participate in 1 or more fixture this year. This is 81% of all the children eligible.**

## Moving into next year....

We will be having 1 AM Sports Staff Member teaching PE per day, along with support from Teaching Assistants. The specific daily timetable highlighting which days the children will have PE will be released soon. We are going to be teaching the children 2 sports each term rather than 1, providing our pupils with further opportunities to increase their learning and knowledge in sport.

Mr Barton will still be responsible for all things Sport and PE at Floreat and managing the coaches as he has done this year.

We will be aiming to have 90% + of all children in Y1-6 participating in at least 1 sporting fixture.

We will continue to be running our after-school clubs every day, with increased opportunities for children in all years.

As always, I would like to thank you all for your support over the past year.

Everyone at AM Sports have loved teaching all the children and seeing them develop in multiple ways.

We wish the Y6 children the best of luck in their new schools - it's been a blast teaching you all this year.
