



FLOREAT WANDSWORTH SPORTS PREMIUM REPORT 2024/25

What is the Sports Premium Grant?

The Sports Premium Grant is additional funding from the Government to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. It is also for improving the health and wellbeing of primary pupils.

How much is the Sports Premium Grant?

Allocations are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6

Schools with 16 or fewer eligible pupils receive £1,000 per pupil.

Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil.

For Floreat Wandsworth Primary School, this amounts to £18,070 for 2024-25.

We are using this allocation to achieve a number of sustainable objectives:

- 1. To develop and enhance the teaching of high-quality PE across the curriculum in all classes.
- 2. To develop the leadership of PE to enable sustainable quality provision.
- 3. To provide opportunities for physical activity due to the restrictions of our site.
- 4. To increase our resources/equipment for the delivery of P.E.

What is the Impact of the Sports Premium Grant?

We anticipate that Sports Premium Grant will lead to:

- Increased opportunities and levels of participation for all of our pupils when accessing a wider variety of PE and Sports (6 themes across the year)
- Opportunities to develop the skills of sportsmanship
- Develop pupil understanding of the importance of keeping fit and healthy, as well as, ways that they can improve their health and fitness.
- Pupils who are fitter, healthier and are motivated to continue to improve.
- Better standards in swimming with bespoke booster classes.

The use of the Sports Premium Grant is monitored and reviewed by the SSB annually.

Professional coaches to support pupils and nurture a love of competitive sport through team training sessions and fixtures against other schools. There will be opportunities for staff to teach and learn alongside professionals as well as planned observations. Impact: Children develop their teamwork skills, self-esteem, core body strength, flexibility, coordination and cognitive functioning. 2024/25 IMPACT - Effort Grades awarded within the school reports display a consistently good standard of effort and participation across all year groups. A number of case studies indicate an improved level of effort from the Autumn/Spring Terms to the Summer Term. More 'A' grades awarded for effort in PE than in 23/24. All pupils in the school engaged in PE within smaller groups and all pupils wade 'good+' progress. No PE lessons will be cancelled due to the impact of the weather and the coaches will be able to spilt into two small groups. PE coaches were then able to support and challenge pupils as required. All pupils from Year 3 to Year 6 have taken part in some form of sporting fixture either at school or as part of a fixture at another school. Inter house competitions have also been held in football and dodgeball. The house teams were led by Year 6 Captains and their deputies.

The school is committed to long term progress for all pupils. We will do this by investing in the following initiatives during 2025-26:

- ✓ Continue to provide extra swimming lessons to those who need it and improve on the percentages recorded during 2025-26.
- \checkmark Invest in more sports equipment for break time including skipping ropes and hoops.
- ✓ Ensure pupils have access to a wide range of interactive and physical activities on the playground.
- ✓ Ensure pupils have access to best possible coaching through the AMSA training model with all coaches overseen by a line manager who will have consistent expectations of pupil progress, achievement, attitudes to sport, levels of participation and behaviour management
- ✓ Focus on physical exercise and play during break time (the school will look into recruiting staff to focus on particular playground activities e.g. basketball).
- ✓ Increase the participation within extra-curricular clubs and ensure pupils receiving Pupil Premium take part in after or before school clubs.
- ✓ Additional fixtures for Key Stage 2 children to add cultural capital of playing a team or individual sport against an increased range of schools e.g. from GLF or out of LA
